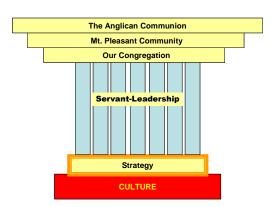

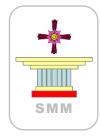

2. FINANCE & STRAT PLAN COMMITTEE – Five Items (pp. 6-10 & last seven)

2.1 Stewardship & Finance Committee Reports, 2018 Financial Statements + 2019 Budget, & Strat Plan Review #2

SMM's STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK (last page): the 5 agenda items of the Finance/Strat Plan Committee were introduced and concluded by a presentation on SMM's STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK (the GSF Trinity). This was done to ensure that everyone had a clear understanding of SMM's governance starting with the congregation (AVM) at the core, and how all activities/committees/ministries of SMM are interrelated with our goals and the budget. Pilong provided the introduction and the conclusion, while James revisited the TEAM OF TEAMS component in his role as nominating chair (agenda item 5)

The focus of the Finance Committee was on the 12 years St. Mike's has been in the black (2007-18). Two graphs can be seen with this 12-year perspective, as part of the Stewardship Report (*page 6*). It includes, for emphasis, two previous years in the red (2005-06), along with this year's budget (2019), while allowing for 2019-2021 (17 years in total). This 17-year form of presentation will be used for the life of the 2021 Strat Plan.

- Given the time spent at the pre-Vestry Congregational Education Sessions, it was possible to cover the Stewardship Report (page 6), Finance Committee Report (p 7), 2 Financial Statements (pp 8 & 9) and the 2019 Budget (p 10) in under 30 minutes. Adopted as a block, MSC'd by Judith Carling and Grace Wandag.
- Included in this blanket ratification was the 7-page 2021 Strat Plan 14 IX 18 Interim Report #2 (last 7 pages), with its primary conclusion, as presented/distributed to the congregation last September:
- For the fifth year in a row, we show the 3 budgeting/financial planning guidelines (ratified at the 2017 Vestry):
 - No Deficits we have had no deficit since our \$20,000+ deficit in 2006.
 - Givings Greater than Rents we first achieved this in 2010.
 - 3. Givings Cover the Assessment + Priest's Salary we first achieved this in 2014.
- STRAT PLAN INTERIM PROGRESS GRAPH (@75%) Vestry was reminded that Padi went to 100% this year (achieving Smart Goal #9). Deacon Eric asked what was meant by 100%, prompting a look back at Padi's 2012 beginnings at SMM, when the parish paid 50% (and the Diocese another 25%). Since 2014, his salary has gone up approximately 7% a year, bringing us in 2019 to 100%.

3. REPORTS - Verbal & Written

10 reports were presented, some with associated Motions, some written, some verbal, as follows (in order of presentation): The Rev. Wilmer Toyoken (Minister's Report), Moses Kajoba (Warden's Report), Brigette Castro (Meal Ministry), Juliana Antonio for Rose Toyoken (Youth Ministry), Pilong Bosaing (Y2H – EAM/ACAM), Terry Cutforth (Buildings & Rentals, verbal), Judith Carling (ACW), Pilong for Richard Paday-os (MBSM), Hiroki Uchino (Choir, verbal), Moses (Day Care, verbal) [Stewardship by Sandra Baldo was presented as part of the Finance Committee package].

3.1 MINISTER'S REPORT - Wilmer

50% INCREASE IN **WORSHIP SERVICES:** Padi's report gave particular emphasis to the growth of worship at SMM since 2015. In 2015, there were 102 worship services at SMM (52 Sundays, plus 50 other); in 2018, this had grown over 50%, to 158 (52 Sundays, plus 104 other) [Editor's note: not included in these numbers are 8:00 am services, which have been in gradual decline, to just 15 in 2018].

25% INCREASE IN SUNDAY ATTENDANCE: Padi also highlighted Sunday attendance (ASA) since adoption of the SMM 2021 Strat Plan in 2014. That growth has been from 83.6 in 2014 to 103.4 in 2018, a growth of nearly 25% in that time.

Padi's great overall report can be seen on page 11. His motion for 2019 Lay Administrators follows:

MOTION 3.1 - LAY ADMINISTRATORS FOR 2019 [MSC Padi, Shirley Sabong] "Per the list read out to the AVM, it was moved by Padi that Vestry ratify those members of the congregation as Lay Administrators for SMM for 2019."

3.2 Warden's Report - **Moses** - The Warden's report (page 12) emphasized the addition of two Trustee's at the 2017 Vestry, and how the experience has exceeded all expectations. Moses also reviewed a few amendments to Padi's job description, and then proposed the following motion:

MOTION 3.2.1 - PADI'S 2019 JOB DESCRIPTION [MSC'd by Moses & Darse Carruthers]

The SMM Wardens move that the AVM ratifies Padi's 2019 job description (page 13).



3.3 MEAL MINISTRY - Brigette highlighted the 2019 Meal Ministry report, as sent in letter form to St. Philip's (*see page 14*) to thank them for their \$2,600 contribution to the Hot Meal program. Brigette also highlighted the contribution begun by Holy Cross in 2018, and how it has allowed for an allotment of \$500 per month for the Meal Ministry Hot Meal. Volunteers for our largest ministry outreach program at St Michael's is growing, with a local bible study group offering up 5 volunteers a month, beginning in March.



- **3.4 YOUTH Juliana** presented for Rose, who is still in the Philippine's. The picture on the front cover of the Annual Report highlights the great year the youth had at SMM, but does not capture the level of effort that the 8 Sunday School/Youth leaders put into the program. The full range of their activities can be seen in the report on page 15. For Meal Ministry, Shawn offered to coordinate the youth volunteers for the monthly Hot Meal. Thanks Shawn!
- **3.5 EAM/ACAM Pilong** gave a very well-received perspective on the Y2H experience with the youth in Hawaii:

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

On their (the youth's) presentation during the Cultural Night (in Hawaii), even with very little preparation, they gave all what they got and they delivered. And I was impressed and even inspired. They did an awesome job, and some said they were the highlight of the event (see the Annual Report cover photo).

I agree when they say, "<u>It takes a village to raise a child</u>." And it's all of you parents, uncles, aunties, manongs, manangs, grandpas, grandmas, friends, teachers and everyone here also deserve the credit for what our youth showed in Hawaii which demonstrated the great job you all had done to them, to our youths. Kudos to you all, kudos to the village of St. Michael!

Deacon Eric Stroo endorsed the theme of Pilong's comments, reflecting on the pride that Archbishop Melissa felt at the wonderful way that St. Michael's displayed the vitality of its multicultural values. The participation and performances of the youth were outstanding, and the support of the adults was conspicuous, both in the numbers that made the trip and the encouragement and sacrifices of those who stayed at home.

- **3.6 BUILDING & RENTAL REPORT Terry Cutforth** helped the Vestry understand what a typical month of maintenance looks like for him at St Michael's. One of the Trustee's asked the Vestry if they noticed anything as they walked up the red stairs into church this morning. After a hesitation, people said "the Salt" (snow was forecast for today). They were then asked if they knew who put it down (they guessed it right). They were then asked if they had ever thanked him for what he does (eyes looking down). Terry interjected that maybe he should get some overtime! (he has been doing this work for 15 years, always as his way of giving to the church).
- **3.7 ACW Judith** presented the report at the top of page 16. The ACW is like Terry in a way; so much happens, almost in the background, that it goes unmentioned. Vestry is a chance to hold these things up. Judith highlighted achieving their objective of \$10,000 in the bank, as well as helping the youth to Hawaii (\$500), and help for the Rosita typhoon victims in the Philippines. She read a letter of gratitude from the Philippines for the \$350 ACW donation.
- **3.8 MBSM Pilong** presented the MBSM report for Richard (on page 16). The MBSM had an active year, with particular emphasis on the youth (donating a guitar, along with \$500 toward Hawaii) and Mission to Seafarers, where they were active in SMM's newest ministry with the Seafarers, including Ship Visitations, special events and donations. A 2019 project of the MBSM will be the drainage project at the Vestry.
- 3.9 CHOIR Hiroki, with our Youth Music Leader at his side, provided choir highlights for 2018, including welcoming new choir member Mr. Jun and inviting more members, especially men (tenor), along with more new songs for communion, with hymns not limited to the CP blue book, as well as collaboration with the youth for a concert, and to make music ministry of St. Michael's more active! After Hiroki's presentation, the Chairman emphasized Hiroki's leadership with regards to ensuring our \$250,000 Organ is maintained properly, as well as his additional contribution in tuning the Piano in the Sanctuary.
- **3.10** DAY CARE Moses presented a very brief update on the Day Care, primarily highlighting its Society Status since 2015. Moses mentioned the 5 Board Members from SMM (Marg & Terry Cutforth, Padi, Moses & Greg), and that we are looking to add two more in 2019. Finally, he highlighted that 2019 is a BCGEU contract renewal year. A fellow Board members ensured Vestry was aware of Moses' vital role in contract negotiations, a role that the other 4 Board members acknowledge could only be done by the Chair.

With the 10 reports done, the Chair sought the following motion:

MOTION 3.10 - ADOPTION OF VESTRY REPORTS [MSC Shirley Sabong, Monica Bosaing]

It is hereby moved that the ten verbal and written 2019 AVM reports (agenda items 3.1 through 3.10) be accepted as read/presented.

4. 2020 ODNW NOMINATION

The Chair emphasized the 2018 Vestry change to SMM's ODNW process, beginning with the next ODNW cycle in 2020. In the past, the Trustee's have worked with the past winner of the ODNW in selecting and recommending the next ODNW nominee to Church Committee and Vestry.

Starting in 2020, a process will be developed giving members of the congregation an opportunity to submit nominees to the Trustees, who in turn will examine the nominees before making a recommendation to the Church Committee and Vestry

5. **ELECTION of OFFICERS & 'TEAM OF TEAMS' - JAMES**

- 5.1 ELECTION OF OFFICERS: The Nominating Committee continued the approach begun in 2012, adhering to the five Constitutional paragraphs pertaining to multiculturalism, and the three traditions. In developing the ballot and the candidates, James Baldo, as Chair of the Committee, ensured these eight criteria were abided by.
 - Per the Constitutional Update ratified in 2017, the two additional Trustee positions continue to be included on the ballot, being mindful that this 'growth' in Trustee positions came about upon examining seven equivalent Diocesan churches on the CRA web-site, where it was found that most of them had at least 8 Trustees.
 - With no nominations from the floor, the ballot was voted on as a slate (see page 17) [MSC'd by James & Betha].
 - Further to Diocesan Canons, it was moved that youth delegates to Synod be included on the ballot as seen on page 17 [MSC'd by James & Judith].
 - Further moved that authority to finalize the names of the two youth be delegated to Church Council, in consultation with the Sunday School/Youth coordinators [MSC'd by James & Shirley].
- 5.2 **TEAM OF TEAMS:** The 2019 TEAM OF TEAMS organization/authority chart/donut as updated (see page 18).
 - Last year, Judith had asked about the absence of the Youth from the TEAM OF TEAMS chart. The chart was subsequently updated, with the youth prominently situated at the top left, along with Meal Ministry (on the top right), and today's election results [MSC'd by James & Sandra].

6. REV ERIC'S TRIP TO THE PHILIPPINE'S

Deacon Eric sketched out the upcoming trip that he and the Archbishop will be making to our diocesan partner, the Episcopal Diocese of Northern Philippines, February 17-27. They will be accompanied by six others from our own diocese: Padi Arvin Amayag, members of the synod staff, newly ordained leaders, and a youth representative.

The itinerary includes a brief stay in Baguio City (with a courtesy visit to Bishop Nestor Poltic), attendance at the diocesan convention in Bontoc, a day trip to Sagada, tree planting and a home stay in Tulgo (Titus deanery), and the opportunity to be visiting preachers at a handful of churches. Eric and Archbishop Melissa are assigned to our sister parish, St. Michael and All Angels. The Archbishop with preach there in Tadian, and Eric will go to the preaching station in Tue.

The deacon is excited to be making the trip and carrying greetings to Bishop Brent Alawas and to the many friends and family members of the SMM parish

A very peaceful, relaxed, productive, and well-attended (60, a new record!) Annual Vestry concluded with a congregational reading of SMM's 2014 *PRAYER FOR VISION 2021*, at 2:10, well ahead of schedule.

NOTE: Prior to final circulation and posting, the minutes, or their portion of the minutes, were reviewed/approved by the Trustees. As is the tradition at St. Mike's, at the first Church Committee meeting after Vestry, these minutes will be read seriatim and accepted, to ensure they are reviewed in detail while the meeting is still fresh in everyone's minds.

NOTE: The next two pages are the cover & inside cover of the 2019 Annual Report/package. The images & graphics were carefully chosen for Vestry, and are repeated on the next two pages so as to preserve the record. All page numbers following the two pages of images & graphics are identical to the page numbers used in the 2019 Vestry package used at the 10 Feb 2019 Vestry.

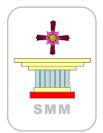






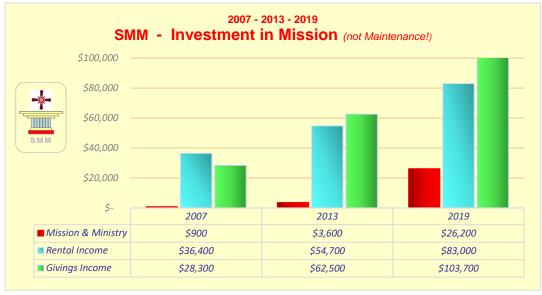

- St. Michael's has successfully transitioned from 10 years (2007 2016) where our income was solely from the plate. In those ten years, growth was still quite remarkable, as can be seen in the *GIVINGS* graph below (top graph).
- Starting in 2017, and continuing in 2018 and beyond, our givings have been augmented by two additional significant items; interest income, and, as required, the Whittaker bequest.
- The focus of the Stewardship Committee will continue to be encouragement of PAD givings, and to strongly support the 4-fold Stewardship Homily program in place since 2011. In 2019, this strategy bore much fruit, with a dramatic increase in PAD givings, growing from \$35,000+ to \$45,000+.
- Finally, the thematic focus of our stewardship campaign in '20 will be to vigorously promote Y2CA (Youth to Camp Artaban) our sponsorship of an EAM Episcopalian/Anglican Youth Leadership Conference (in Aug 2020). This is a completion of the 2018-2019-2020 trinity of Y2H-Y2C-Y2CA and a natural follow-on to their July 2019 Y2C EAM pilgrimage to San Francisco, and their Sept 2018 Y2H EAM Hawaii trip with the Bishop.

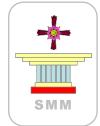




ANNUAL REPORT 2.2 - FINANCE/STRAT PLAN 21 COMMITTEE - 2007 to 2019

The Finance Committee (FC) hereby presents SMM's 2019 Financial Statements and Reports (p-6 to p-9), with particular emphasis on the 13 years in the black (2007-2019), after 2 years of deep losses (2005-2006).

- The Stewardship Report's two p-8 graphs gives a sense for this (Givings, & Mission Funding).
- Our 2019 financials were significantly helped out by continued growth in PAD, and by significant growth in rental income (Pear Tree & Haim Korean Church).



The 15 years on page 8 (2007-2021) can be thought of as three different 5 year periods, as follows:

- 1. The Sunday Supply Era ('07 '11) without a regular priest, but with an active, growing congregation.
- 2. Padi Alone ('12 '16) finally, our own regular priest!
- 3. Padi + Rev Eric ('17 21) beginning March '17 when Eric was announced as our permanent Deacon.

Context regarding the relative historical accomplishments of the three era's follows:

Era 1: In the 1st 5-year period, '07-'11, see the 2019 Annual Report for a full description.

Era 2: In the 2nd 5-year period, '12-'16, see the 2019 Annual Report for a full description.

2019 2017 & 2018 were tough acts to follow, but we believe we continued their golden status in 2019:

- Y2C: 15 youth & 2 adults attended their 2nd International EAM Youth Leadership Conference (this time in San Francisco), while a new renter let us commit \$12,000+ to support them.
- **2** Worship+4: formalized our *Worship+4* Ministries (4 = Meal, EAM, Youth, & Mission to Seafarers), with increased financial commitments in the first three, continuing in 2020.
- 3 Holy Land: had three SMM'ers go on a tour of the Holy Land (Padi, Dolores & Pauline).
- 4. Web-site: a new web-site went into service 27 Jan 2020, replacing our 10-year old site.
- 5. Keys: the entire building was re-keyed; this security provision last occurred in 2012.
- 6. Rental Committee (RC): recommended to this Vestry that the RC (and the keys) fall under the umbrella of the Finance & Stat Plan Committee. Along with the Stewardship Committee, this represents 90%+ of SMM Income.

Two (out of many) other special events were: the youth taking our *Igorot* culture to the Surrey Museum (see inside cover, top picture), and the Manning Park July Retreat (see cover picture), one aspect of which was Rev. Eric gifting attendees & the Youth with the book *PATRON SAINTS OF NOTHING (Ribay)*.

Era 3:

The 3rd 5-year period, '17-'21, will be the 3rd for five of the Finance Committee members (and the 2nd for Padi). With most capital projects completed (excepting the long-term Wheelchair access project & a Rectory basement washroom), we can focus on 2 things over the next two years: one, bringing Padi to 100%, and, two, continued focus on the 21 SMART goals set out in our 7-year 2021 STRAT PLAN.

3 COMMANDMENTS: In presenting the 2020 Budget to the AVM for ratification, the FC reminds Vestry of the 3 Diocesan Commandments/Guidelines (below), the bedrock of our budget process since 2007.

- 2020 will be the **Seventh** straight year when we have achieved all three, which in our 17-year view (previous page graphs) reminds us that it took us until 2014 (8 years) to get our finances into sound enough shape that we finally achieved all 3.
 - 1. No Deficits we have had no deficit since our \$20,000+ deficit in 2006.
 - 2. Givings Greater than Rents first achieved this in 2010.
 - Givings Cover the Assessment + Priest's Salary achieved in 2014.

3rd STRAT PLAN REVIEW:

STRAT PLAN 21 Reviews are mandated biennially (once every 2 years). 2018 was the 2nd of 3 such reviews over the 7-year life of the plan (2015-2021). 2016 was the 1st.



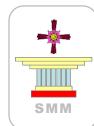
- The 2021 STRAT PLAN was originally ratified by the Strat Plan Team on 14-IX-14.
- Exactly two years later, on 14-IX-16, the same team ratified the first of 3 reviews.
- The STRAT PLAN team ratified the 2nd biennial review on 14-IX-18.
- The 3rd biennial review will be at a Kelowna retreat in April 2020. Considerations will include succession planning & a follow-on to STRAT PLAN 2021 (STRAT PLAN 2028).

2020: REFINEMENT/CONSOLIDATION

- After 3 quite frenetic years (FilCon 2017 & then Y2H & Y2C in '18 & '19), including the start/maturation of three dynamic new ministries (Youth, Seafarers, & Evening Prayer), it is anticipated that 2020 will be a less frenetic year, but still full of exciting initiatives (esp. Y2CA and STRAT PLAN 2028 considerations).
- Refinement/consolidation will include Y2CA (the Youth to Camp Artaban), a 7th retreat (STRAT PLAN 2021 & 28?), continued emphasis on our *Worship+4* Ministries (Meal Ministry, EAM/ACAM, Youth & Seafarers), plus implementation of Pilong's Diocesan School Project for Sunday recognition/welcoming's (see letter on page 18).

2. PARISH CLERGY

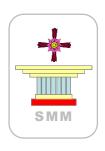

Greetings of the New Year to the three of you, and, through you, to the St. Philip's OUTREACH COMMITTEE that so generously participates in and supports the Tri-Parish Meal Ministry Program in the Mt. Pleasant area.

Our annual AVM to AVM update for you and your Committee continues to highlight success.

After program changes initiated by the GVFBS in January of 2016, the program stabilized in 2017, evolved in 2018, and found a new equilibrium in 2019.

- 1. Financials for 2020, we have increased the budget up to \$8,440 (up from \$7,620 in 2019 & \$6,600 in 2018), over 30% of which (\$2,600) comes from you in the OUTREACH COMMITTEE. In 2019, your generosity allowed us to move, for the first time ever, to \$500 a month for the food for the Hot Meal (plus \$1,000 for Thanksgiving Turkeys). The Budget provides for this to continue in 2020.
- 2. Thanksgiving this was the biggest Hot Meal event of the 28 held in 2019. With the extra help provided by your OUTREACH COMMITTEE, specifically for this event, we were able in 2019 to increase funding for this meal from \$500 to \$1,000, and have budgeted the same amount for 2020.
- 3. St Philip's Night Catherine & Paul & Moira continue to Team-up in leading the 2nd Thursday Food Bank each month. It makes such a difference having a Team that is so reliable and so much fun! We really would like your OUTREACH COMMITTEE to appreciate our thankfulness, and that of our clients, for their service.

In addition to our thanks for your continued time & treasure & talent support, we continue to be available to your committee if you would like to know more, as we have been happy to do in the past.

- Donated a VCD player for the church. Thank you Fidel.

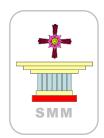

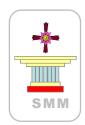

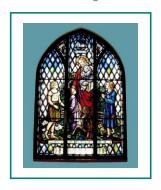
Cyril's Donut - St. Michael's Organizational Structure

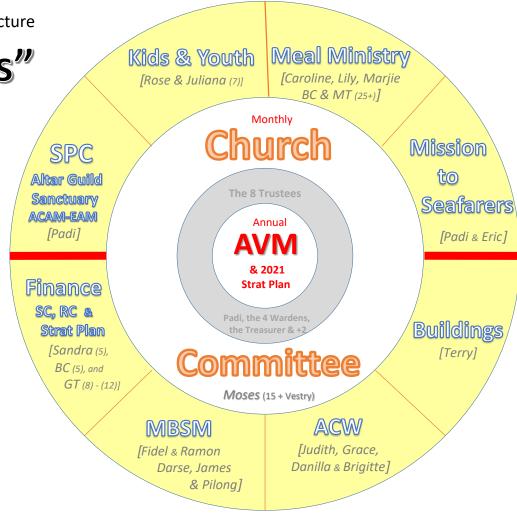

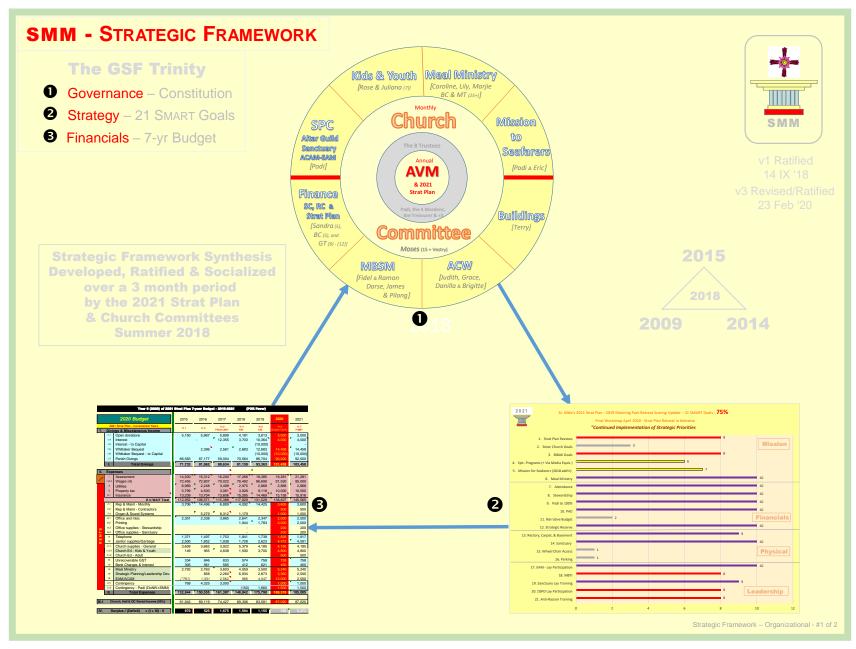

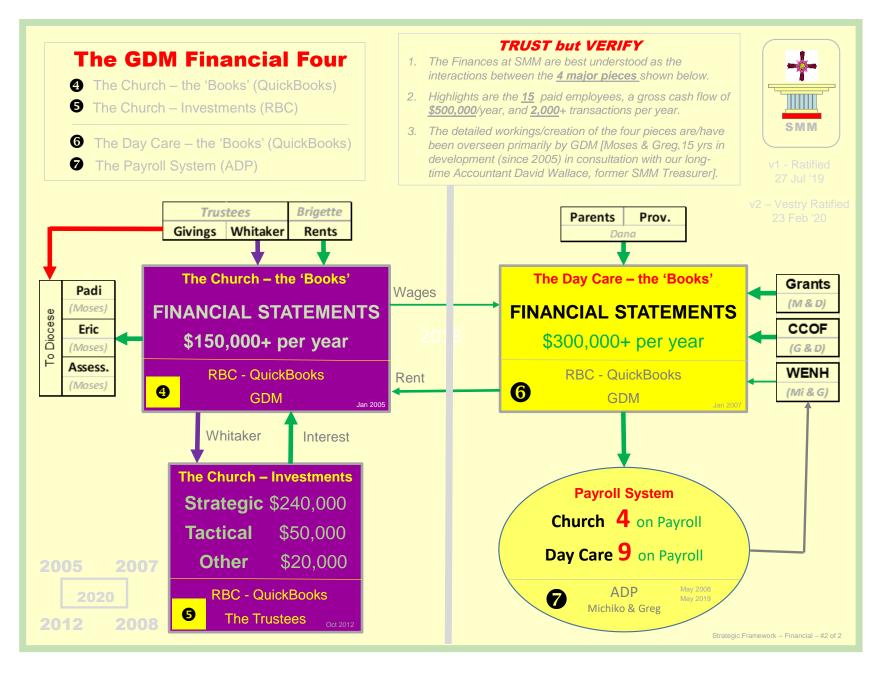
